

IOPC public interest disclosures 2022/23

The Independent Office for Police Conduct (IOPC) oversees the police complaints system in England and Wales. We investigate the most serious matters, including deaths following police contact, and set the standards by which the police should handle complaints. We use learning from our work to influence changes in policing.

By law we are required to publish information about qualifying disclosures. A qualifying disclosure describes a situation in which a police officer or staff member passes on information, which they believe is in the public interest, that another police officer or staff member is doing, or is likely to do, something wrong or criminal.
