

IOPC public interest disclosures 2018/19 and 2019/20

The Independent Office for Police Conduct (IOPC) oversees the police complaints system in England and Wales. We investigate the most serious matters, including deaths following police contact, and set the standards by which the police should handle complaints. We use learning from our work to influence changes in policing. By law we are required to publish information about qualifying disclosures. A qualifying disclosure is when a police officer or staff member gives information, which they believe is in the interest of the public, that another police officer or staff member is doing or is likely to do something wrong or criminal. You can read about qualifying disclosures in the <u>Public interest Disclosure Act guidance</u> under point 6.

The required information for financial years 2018/19 and 2019/20 is set out below.
